Both courses work to develop and integrate contextual, theoretical, and studio-based learning centred on in-depth research projects. The programme culminates in a final exhibition or presentation of studio research outcomes and an accompanying written research summary.

The Honours qualification provides a foundational pathway for further research in a higher degree.
